

# Give A Kid A Book

## Book Collection Guidelines

1. Books must be new or very gently used.
  - Intact spines...No writing or highlighting...No torn or worn covers/pages
  - Helpful: make any minor repairs before boxing the books
  - Paperback and hard cover are both collected
  
2. Fiction
  - Can be a variety of genres: classics, romance, mystery, etc.
  - Books for babies and toddlers are collected
  - Children's picture books with text, or wordless
  - Children's novels (chapter books...some easy, some more difficult)
  - Young adult novels (avoid stereotypes)
  - Highly desired: picture books or novels featuring children of color, or stories of Africa and specifically, African children
  - Highly desired: large books, called by category, "Big Books" – approximately 22" x 18" (Scholastic, Macmillan, etc.)
  
3. Nonfiction
  - Current, not published before 2000
  - Desired areas: science, technology, history, geography, etc.
  - These books should be written for children
  - Plentiful, attractive illustrations...clear writing
  - Information finding tools such as table of contents, index, graphs, etc.
  - Not specific to the US, e.g., US history/civics – not written from a US point of view
  - Highly desired: children's encyclopedias (one volume or many), atlases, maps, children's dictionaries
  - Highly desired: DK (Dorling Kindersley) Eyewitness Books (for children)...a list is available at [www.dk.com](http://www.dk.com)
  
4. Teaching/Learning Materials
  - Posters – content about books/reading...science/math information, etc.
  - Charts/maps (current)
  - Education games: checkers, chess, Uno, Othello, etc.
  - Flash cards...dice...magnets...protractors/metric rulers/compasses... legos/Tinkertoys/building materials...magnetic letters/wooden puzzles... Jacks/jump rope clothesline...math manipulatives/marbles
  - Construction paper, lined paper, pencils/pens/markers/glue sticks
